## **A Few Thoughts for the Week**

'Thou hast made us for Thyself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it finds its rest in Thee.'

'There are no ordinary people. You have never talked to a mere mortal. Nations, cultures, arts, civilizations - these are mortal, and their life is to ours as the life of a gnat. But it is immortals whom we joke with, work with, marry, snub and exploit - immortal horrors or everlasting splendours. This does not mean that we are to be perpetually solemn. We must play. But our merriment must be of that kind (and it is, in fact, the merriest kind) which exists between people who have, from the outset, taken each other seriously - no flippancy, no superiority, no presumption.'

'If God were our one and only desire we would not be so easily upset when our opinions do not find outside acceptance.'

'We sinned for no reason but an incomprehensible lack of love, and He saved us for no reason but an incomprehensible excess of love.'

*The Kingdom of God is Justice and Peace.* This is the first line of a relatively new hymn. How we yearn for this truth to be recognised! All around us we see injustice, intolerance and inequality, as well as a great lack of peace. But today we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King, the feast that ends the Church's year. Whatever has happened, it's great to finish

on this wonderful feast, for we put all our sins, fears and troubles within his realm and allow him to forgive each of us.

His kingdom isn't here yet; it hasn't quite come to fruition. But God, in Jesus Christ, has said to us 'Do not be afraid' and 'Why do you lack faith?' Yes, we're waiting for Jesus's second coming, but each day we have the opportunity to allow His kingdom to come just a little bit more through our prayers and through our service to his world. May we wait on the Lord as we prepare to enter Advent. May we trust in Him who saves. May we have confidence and joy as we wait on the Lord to bring justice and peace. And let us remember that in the Sacraments and in the Word, the kingdom of Jesus Christ is already with us. May we be joyful in this time of expectation, for God is coming, in and through us all. As Henri Nouwen said:

'Waiting patiently for God always includes joyful expectation. Without expectation our waiting can get bogged down in the present. When we wait in expectation our whole beings are open to be surprised by joy.'

All through the Gospels Jesus tells us to keep awake, to stay alert. And Paul says, 'Brothers and sisters... the moment is here for you to stop sleeping and wake up, because by now our salvation is nearer than when we first began to believe. The night is nearly over, daylight is on the way; so let us throw off everything that belongs to the darkness and equip ourselves for the light'. (Romans 13:11-12).

It is this joyful expectation of God's coming that offers vitality to our lives. The expectation of the fulfilment of God's promises to us is what allows us to pay full attention to the road on which we are walking. God bless you as you once more own Christ as the King of your hearts and may you find great joy in serving other people. Alleluia!!
